To prove himself to his sweetheart, Hugo joins the British Army but must face deeper questions of identity, love and loyalty... with unexpected answers.

Based on a true story by Hilda De Felice, Loving the Enemy was originally penned as a movie and later adapted for the stage by acclaimed dramatist Lorenzo Novani. Artist Susan MacColl is delighted to return to the HAC with a series of work on West Coast landscapes in watercolour and textile felts and thread. Susan enjoys how both mediums work by blending colours, the textile work by felt blending fleece into unique and magical materials, thereafter, to be embroidered with stitch.

The exhibition will incorporate raw live sketchbook work, new works inspired from intakes in situ and retrospective pieces. Susan's most recent work is developing from a visit to Machrie Standing stones on Arran, which rekindled a fascination with the legend of Giant Fingal and his dog Bran - tethered to a stone while cooking in a cauldron in the inner circle. A perfect circle. An unusual take told to Susan by her grandfather, Alexander Thorn.

Freckfest Presents: Brian Molley Quartet




Woman Walking



The Ghosting of Rabbie Burns



The bold and brilliant Because We Said We Would is a production both brimming with audacious invention, and poignant enough to reduce both the performers and the audience members to tears.






Freckfest Presents: Nigel Clarke (from Dodgy)
