

Flow: An exhibition inspired by the architecture of Irvine New Town by Ally Wallace



Glasgow based artist Ally Wallace works across a range of disciplines, including drawing, sculpture and film, to make artworks that reflect his interest in Modernist architecture.

"My exhibition at Harbour Arts Centre features work inspired by trips to Irvine to sketch and film the exterior of the town's indoor shopping centre, Rivergate, which opened in 1975 as part of the construction of Irvine New Town. Originally named the Irvine Centre but always known locally as the Mall, the shopping centre retains much of its original Brutalist exterior and I am particularly interested in the way that the concrete structure forms a bridge over the River Irvine, creating a cavernous, riverine space below.






