

David Reid

4 September - 25 October

This exhibition features portraits, floral still lifes, and landscapes, developed through a quietly observational approach that hopefully emphasizes clarity and character. In portraiture, likeness is a central aim — I work to reflect both physical accuracy and the sitter's presence.

I'm drawn to the look and feel of paint itself: how brushstrokes carry weight, light, and emotion. The still lifes explore fragile beauty, while the landscapes reflect a sense of place and attachment to memory. Each piece encourages slow looking, inviting viewers to engage not only with the image, but with the expressive potential of paint.

Freckfest presents: Ed Tudor-Pole - Songs and Stories from a Punk Rock Icon



Only Father Welsh, the local young priest, is willing to attempt to bring them together before their petty squabbling's spiral into vicious and bloody carnage.

When you count BBC Radio 2 legend, 'Whispering' Bob Harris as a fan, the rest of the world sits up and pays attention.

Very soon, the UK circuit turned white hot with excitement, Brent won an invitation to appear at Glasgow's Celtic Connections festival, and on her second UK tour she began packing them in. Then Bob invited her into the studio for a live BBC session. Her 2020 tour was to be her most successful yet, with many shows sold out. Then the pandemic struck - in mid-tour - and she was forced to fly home as venues shut up shop and transatlantic flights were withdrawn.

The tour was set up to promote her latest album, Undercover, hailed by many reviewers as her best yet. Fans continued ask when she'd be back and, although it's been a while, this will be a by-popular demand and a long-overdue return.




Freckfest presents: Kirsten Adamson and the Tanagers

summers soaking up the atmosphere in Nashville
with her dad and singing on Big Country's 'Driving
to Damascus' album, Kirsten has been steadily
developing her own voice and songwriting.

Her second solo album Landing Place (2023) is a glorious powerhouse of emotionally charged, beautifully delivered songs that bustles and glistens with echoes of folk rock and country gems. It was launched at Glasgow's Celtic Connections, an official showcase at London's UK Americana Music Festival 2023 and a sold-out UK tour in April. Adamson's track My Father's Songs has recently been nominated for an Americana UK Award for UK Song of the Year 2024.




The Naked Neds

Freckfest presents: Cowboy Mouth

Cowboy Mouth release their first new track in 30 years on the Last Night from Glasgow label.

Cowboy Mouth formed in 1994 by Skinner and MacIntyre, releasing two albums in quick succession on the Hamburg-based Marina label. The albums - Life as a Dog (1994) and Love Is Dead (1995) - were well received prior to the group taking a hiatus. Last Night from Glasgow reissued Life as a Dog last year, resulting in some concerts with label mates The Bathers for which Allan and Hannah joined the group.

The chemistry between the four musicians was immediate, resulting in songs being written and an album being recorded. The songs perhaps highlight their interest in Lou Reed's Berlin and Coney Island Baby albums, with pre-production rehearsals taking place on a farm in rural South Lanarkshire.

Grahame Skinner achieved international success as vocalist with Hipsway, whose debut album and attendant hit single (The Honeythief) provided the opportunity to tour the world.


Freckfest presents: Nick Heyward



Freckfest present: Kris Drever

Kris Drever originally comes from Hrossey in the Orkney Islands.

Over the years, he has taught himself to be a songwriter, guitarist and singer of note (and sometimes many notes).

As well as creating award-winning original songs and instrumental pieces with the trio Lau, he has had a fruitful solo career exploring the cracks between classic and modern songwriting and the traditional music that he comes from.

Drever's sound is rooted in the earthy and hypnotic rhythms of much older music, but there's a sophistication to both the lyricism and the instrumentalism which places him skilfully in the present. He has an extensive collection of BBCR2 Folk awards, plus awards for everything from best album, best singer and best live act to best original song.

The band split up in the mid-80s but enjoyed a revival in 1993 when 'Young at Heart' was re-issued as a single after appearing in a TV advert, staying at No.1 for four weeks and led to the band reforming temporarily to perform the song on Top of the Pops.

As the name might suggest, there are strong links between Wales and North America, for the band, Taff Rapids

Fast becoming one of the most talked about bands both at home and abroad, they have a Canadian up front on vocals/banjo (and writing), are Cardiff-based, and have a Scot on fiddle. They have been taking the US Bluegrass scene by storm with their blistering style. In the home of the genre, even the diehards of tradition love them so much that they want the four-piece to head back over there – and make it quick!

Taff Rapids were invited to take part in the prestigious World of Bluegrass event last year; the band completed a successful tour over there and headed home with "come back soon" requests ringing in their ears. This year, they released their new album after returning from a triumphant second American tour, and BBC Radio 6's Cerys Matthews instantly declared herself a fan and told listeners they'd delivered an "interesting curveball" that deserved a lot of attention.


