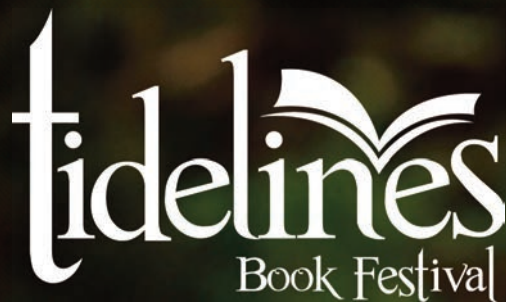
Robert Burns is living the dream: unshackled from earthly constraints, he's spending eternity in a 'dead poets society' jousting with a plethora of poetry A-listers.

Freckfest presents: The Pistol Daisys

Pistol Daisys are a fierce and emotionally charged alt-pop trio from Glasgow, Scotland, fronted by co-lead vocalists Belly and Lorna Lynne with drummer-producer Lewis Kelly.

Their sound blends gritty Glaswegian energy with shimmering synths, dancefloor grooves, and confessional storytelling, drawing comparisons to Blondie, The Gossip, and CHVRCHES.

Formed in 2023, the band have already built serious momentum with a run of singles including St. Glasgow, Crying in Marseille, Calling Your Name, and their latest double release I Taste Like Honey / Wolves. Their self-titled debut album will be released in October 2025 on One RPM, followed by a 40-date UK and European tour.

Known for their electric chemistry and fearless stagecraft, Pistol Daisys have played major Scottish festivals including Belladrum and Party at the Palace, supported acts such as Big Country, GUN, and Callum Beattie, and headlined venues across the UK. Internationally, they have already appeared in France at Class EU Rock to an audience of 15,000.

Their appearance at Reeperbahn Festival 2025 came at a pivotal moment—just weeks after the release of their debut mini album—making it the perfect platform to introduce their music to the European industry. With growing support from BBC Introducing, STV, and a rapidly expanding fanbase, Pistol Daisys are ready to take their story from Glasgow to the world and Irvine!"

A Road Well Travelled: An Exhibition by Jack Rigg

Friday 9 January - Thursday 26 February

Exhibition Launch: Saturday 24 January 1pm - 3pm

Artist and former art teacher Jack Rigg presents a collection of oil landscapes that capture the historic journey between Mossgiel near Mauchline and Ellisland near Dumfries, a route famously travelled by Robert Burns.

Each painting blends technical precision with storytelling, inviting viewers to imagine the narratives within. Central to a book called "A Road Well Travelled," the story is about the journeys on that road made in the late 18th century by Robert Burns and others from more recent times.

There are many artists who have painted pictures of places associated with Robert Burns; indeed, many include imagined images of him and his associates in Ayrshire and Dumfriesshire settings.

These pictures however are contemporary scenes, pictured from spots where Burns or other 18th century travellers could have stood. Although much will have changed, they are scenes that he and his contemporaries would, for the most part, recognise.

Jack was born in Edinburgh in 1945 but has spent most of his life in Ayrshire. Educated at Kilmarnock Academy, Jack is proud to have been a pupil there in an outstanding art and design department, indeed of his senior class seven subsequently attended the Glasgow School of Art.





On leaving GSA Jack had a brief flirtation with the airline business before continuing his studies at Jordanhill College of Education. Thereafter Jack taught in Ayrshire for 41 years before retiring.

Throughout his career Jack continued to paint and exhibit and take private commissions. He has work in private collections in the USA, Canada and in the UK.

Jack makes no secret of the fact that his work tends towards the traditional and representational; in short, he strives to make his pictures look like the location or person.



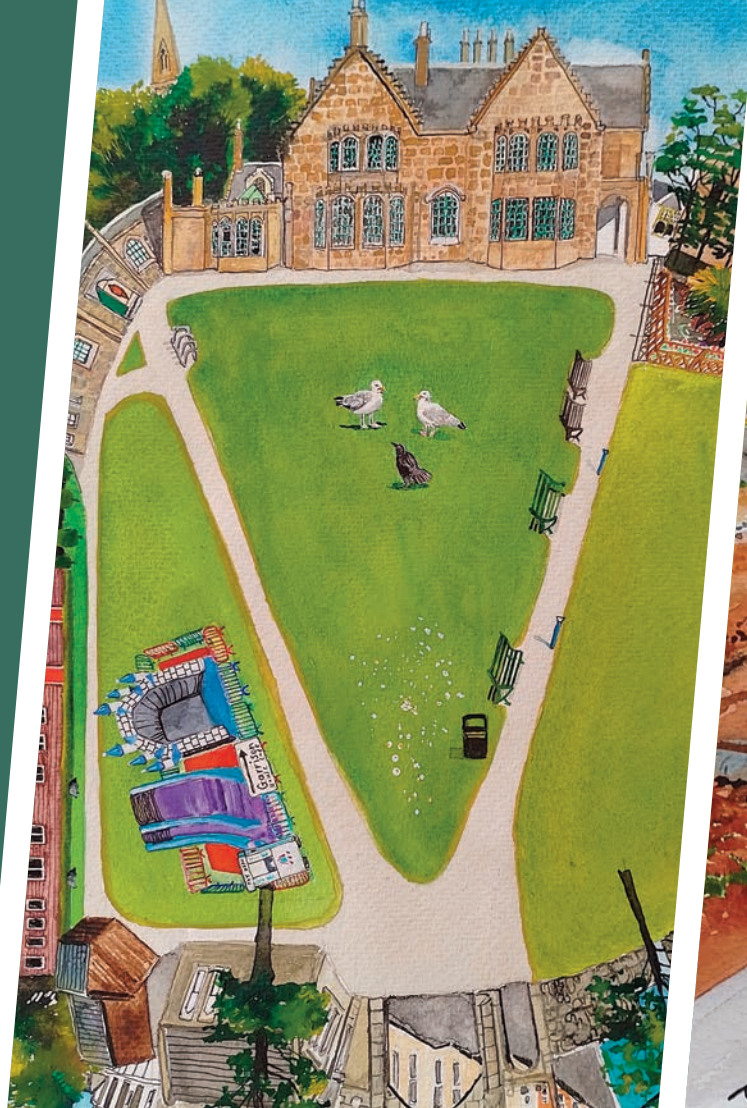
An Exhibition of Work by Stephen Jordan
